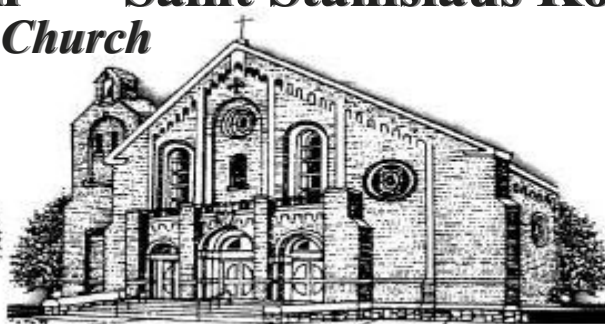

This year marked the 50th anniversary of the **World Day of Peace Message**. The World Day of Peace, celebrated on January 1st, is a Catholic Feast Day dedicated to universal peace on the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. On this occasion, The Pope generally makes authoritative declarations on Catholic Social Teachings (CST) that reflect on our current social reality.



This year's message is **Dialogue Between Generations, Education and Work: Tools for Building Lasting Peace**. In his continued interest in building a "culture of care" in light of the pandemic and on-going violence in our world, Pope Francis challenges us to consider the following three conditions for building a lasting peace:

- **Dialogue between generations:** Dialogue is the key word for this condition. Rather than succumbing to the social and political divisiveness that seems to define our current reality, Pope Francis calls us to be promoters of dialogue and discussion in order to build mutual trust with one another and to build a culture where we find ourselves "listening to one another, sharing different views, coming to agreement and walking together."
- **Investment in education:** Pope Francis is again inviting us to promote education and formation for our youth, so that they can form "a common language working to break down barriers and build bridges." This is a crucial condition for us to build a culture of care with one another and our Earth. Where competition, divisiveness and self-interest that defines our media and political experience let us educate our youth in the model of collaboration, unity and sustainability.
- **Dignified employment opportunities:** Pope Francis re-

minds us that one of the central pillars of CST is to promote "decent and dignified working conditions, oriented to the common good and to the safeguarding of creation." To accomplish this, Pope Francis also reminds us that we must employ advocacy so that our political system can "...play an active role by promoting a fair balance between economic freedom and social justice."

In today's world, which increasingly faces the challenges of social injustice, division and conflict that hinder the realization of the common good, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s dream of harmony and equality for all people, attained through non-violent and peaceful means, remains ever timely. "Each one of us is called to be an artisan of peace, by uniting and not dividing, by extinguishing hatred and not holding on to it, by opening paths of dialogue" (Fratelli Tutti, 284). In this way we will be able to see ourselves, not as "others", but as neighbors, in the truth of our shared dignity as children of Almighty God. Only by striving daily to put this vision into practice can we work together to create a community built upon justice and fraternal love.
