"Ite ad Ioseph!"

"Go to Joseph." This is advice offered by great saints down through the ages. St. Teresa of Avila, for example, the great sixteenth century reformer of the Carmelite Order, faced great opposition from within and outside of her Order (nobody likes to be reformed!) as she founded her new monasteries. To whom did she turn? *I took for my advocate and lord the glorious St. Joseph... this father and lord of mine came to my rescue in better ways than I knew how to ask for. I don't recall up to this day ever having petitioned him for anything that he has failed to grant... For with other saints it seems the Lord has given them grace to be of help in one need, whereas with this glorious saint I have experience that he helps in all our needs and that the Lord wants us to understand that just as He was subject to St. Joseph on earth – for since bearing the title of father, being the Lord's tutor, Joseph could give the Child commands – so in heaven God does whatever He commands.* [The Book of Her Life, chapter six.] Teresa named her first reformed convent St. Joseph's, and her reform flourished.

Scripture does not tell us much about St. Joseph – none of his words are preserved – but what is recorded of him is precious and significant. During his betrothal to our blessed Lady, she was found to be expecting a child. Joseph knew this was not his child. He resolved to break off the engagement, thus shielding Mary from public scorn and taking upon himself the disap-

proval of people by seeming to abandon her while she was expecting his child. But an angel of the Lord spoke in a dream to him (Matthew 1:18-25) and told him not to fear taking Mary as his wife: so he stepped forward in faith and did so.

As God the Father had chosen and prepared the perfect Mother for His Son, so he chose the perfect foster father, spouse for Mary and Guardian and Protector of the Holy Family. With Mary, He presented Jesus to God in the Temple, as the Law required (Luke 2:22-38). When Herod sought out the Child to destroy Him, Joseph shepherded the Holy Family to the safety of Egypt (Matthew 2:13-23) until the Angel told him it was safe to return. He supported our blessed Lady in the heartbreaking confusion of having to search for the lost Jesus for three days (Luke 2:41-50). And Joseph provided and guarded the home in which the Son of God resided until His public ministry began. *The Hidden Years*, we call them, for we know almost nothing about them. But they were of eternal significance, for they were part of the life of God Incarnate on earth, and just as our lives, yours and mine here in Maspeth, do not attract the attention the celebrities of the world seem to garner without effort on their part, so the Lord Jesus lived most of His life on this earth in hiddenness and quiet, faithful, prayerful, doing God's Will. This was the Father's plan, and Joseph made possible the space where it would be lived out.

The Patron Saint of Fathers is Saint Joseph, who was the foster father of our Lord Jesus Christ. *Guardian and Protector of the Universal Church* is another title bestowed

upon Him. *Patron of carpenters, of workers* are other titles; indeed, May 1st is the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. He is also the patron of something we should all hope for: he is *Patron of a Happy Death*. Joseph had the privilege of being attended by Jesus and Mary at his deathbed. *From sudden and unprovided death, Deliver us, O Lord* is a traditional invocation of the Litany. We pray that we may die in the friendship of God, having had the chance to make our final Confession, receive Absolution, to be Anointed, to receive Holy Viaticum, our *Food for the Journey*; to tell God one last time that we love Him.

Pope Francis has declared this a **Year of St Joseph**. In this marvelous family Parish, we have Christian homes for which to pray, and Christian fathers. We therefore are calling for a **nine day prayer**, a **NOVENA**, leading up to Fathers' Day. It will begin

FRIDAY JUNE 11th, to

SATURDAY JUNE 19th

Novena prayers will be said every day at Mass. And, we hope, in every home in our parish (*before or after your evening meal, over dessert, before retiring for the evening, whenever it works for you and your loved ones!*).

Then, on Sunday June 20th, 2021, at all Masses:
