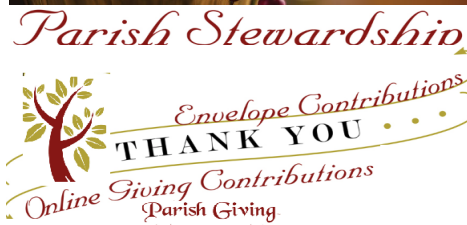

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER



May 9



Although "mother festivals" can be traced back to ancient times, the first real predecessor to the holiday we celebrate today can be found in the late 1800's. Around the year 1870, Ann Jarvis created a Mother's Friendship Day to try to unite families that had been separated during the Civil War. On May 9, 1914, President Woodrow Wilson declared the second Sunday of May a national holiday on which to fly the flag to honor those mothers whose sons died at war. It has since been expanded to include all mothers.

Ann died before she could see the expansion of the celebration, a work continued by her daughter, Anna. Anna Jarvis offers two ideas about today's holiday that deserve some attention.

First, she insisted that the apostrophe be placed before the "s" so that each mother would be recognized. It is not only a celebration of motherhood but more specifically the opportunity for each family to acknowledge their mother. President Wilson used the same grammar in the national declaration.

Anna Jarvis is also credited with having written, "A printed card means nothing except that you are too lazy to write to the woman who has done more for you than anyone in the world. And candy! You take a box to Mother—and then eat most of it yourself. A pretty sentiment."

Although I sent printed cards when my mother was alive, I understand the more basic meaning of this quotation. The flowers, candy and cards do not mean much unless they are accompanied by heartfelt respect and affection.

Wear a face covering to your appointment. You will not be admitted to the site without one.

WHAT: Johnson & Johnson Vaccine

WHO: All New Yorkers 18 years of age and older are now eligible to be vaccinated. People who work or study in New York are also eligible.

Proof of Eligibility

New Yorkers must bring proof of age and New York residency. Minors must have identification to verify they are at least 16 years of age, or they must have a parent or legal guardian present to attest on their behalf. A parent or legal guardian must also provide consent for vaccination — either in person or by phone — at the time of the vaccine appointment.

People who live outside of New York must bring proof of age and that they work or study in New York.

You will not need to provide proof of immigration status or a social security number to get vaccinated. ID and residency documentation for proof of eligibility is to confirm eligibility for vaccination.

When you receive the vaccine, your privacy will be protected. There are strict laws in place to ensure confidentiality of your personal information.

Employment

Proof of work or employment in New York may include one of the following:

- An employee ID card or badge
- A letter from an employer or affiliated organization

A pay stub, depending on specific priority status

Residency/Age

Proof that you are a New York resident and 18 or older may include:

- Driver's license or non-driver ID
- IDNYC
- State or government-issued birth certificate
- Consulate ID
- Current U.S. passport or valid foreign passport
- Permanent resident card
- Certificate of Naturalization or Citizenship
- Life insurance policy with birthdate
- Marriage certificate with birthdate
- Statement from landlord (residency proof)
- Current rent receipt or lease (residency proof)
- Mortgage records (residency proof)

If you do not have one of the above to prove residency, you will need two of the following:

- Statement from another person
- Current mail
- School records

QUÉ: Vacuna Johnson & Johnson

QUIÉN: Todos los neoyorquinos de 18 años o más ahora son elegibles para vacunarse. Las personas que trabajan o estudian en Nueva York también son elegibles.

Prueba de elegibilidad

Los neoyorquinos deben traer prueba de edad y residencia en Nueva York. Los menores deben tener una identificación para verificar que tienen al menos 16 años de edad, o deben tener un padre o tutor legal presente para dar fe en su nombre. Un padre o tutor legal también debe dar su consentimiento para la vacunación, ya sea en persona o por teléfono, en el momento de la cita para la vacunación.

Las personas que viven fuera de Nueva York deben presentar un comprobante de edad y de que trabajan o estudian en Nueva York.

No será necesario que proporcione prueba de su estado migratorio o un número de seguro social para vacunarse. La documentación de identificación y residencia como prueba de elegibilidad es para confirmar la elegibilidad para la vacunación.

Cuando reciba la vacuna, su privacidad estará protegida. Existen leyes estrictas para garantizar la confidencialidad de su información personal.

Empleo

La prueba de trabajo o empleo en Nueva York puede incluir uno de los siguientes:

Una tarjeta de identificación de empleado o una insignia.

Una carta de un empleador u organización afiliada.

Un talón de pago, según el estado de prioridad específico

Residencia / Edad

La prueba de que es residente de Nueva York y tiene 18 años o más puede incluir:

Licencia de conducir o identificación de no conductor

IDNYC

Acta de nacimiento emitida por el estado o el gobierno

Identificación del consulado

Pasaporte estadounidense actual o pasaporte extranjero válido

Tarjeta de residencia permanente

Certificado de naturalización o ciudadanía

Póliza de seguro de vida con fecha de nacimiento

Acta de matrimonio con fecha de nacimiento

Declaración del propietario (prueba de residencia)

Recibo de alquiler actual o contrato de arrendamiento (comprobante de residencia)

Registros hipotecarios (prueba de residencia)

Si no tiene uno de los anteriores para demostrar su residencia, necesitará dos de los siguientes:

Declaración de otra persona

Correo actual

Expediente educativo
