

Here is some more information about the 2020 Census:

NYC Census 2020 is trying to get as many New Yorkers as possible to take the US Census. The census takes place every 10 years and determines how many people live in different areas in our country. But it also determines so much more — the funding our neighborhoods get for public education, affordable housing, infrastructure, and our representation in Congress (NYC could lose two House seats in the next census!). With the coronavirus, filling out the census is more important than ever to ensure we filling out the census is more important than ever to ensure we get fair distribution of resources in our communities in the future.

In the 2010 census, the city's self-response rate was less than 62%, compared to the national average of 76%. In some neighborhoods, especially in Queens and Brooklyn, some self-response rates were as low as 35%. To prevent this undercount from happening again, we need to get more people engaged, involved, and counted in the census as ever!

The census is 10 questions and is private. By law, the information you list cannot be accessed by any other government agency, including ICE.



We discover the answers to these questions most completely by encountering Jesus. He longs to help us discover deeply personal answers to our deeply personal questions.


